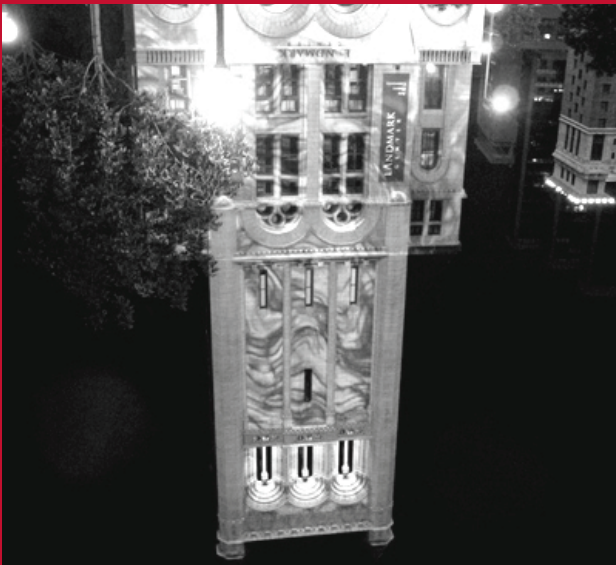

**American Association of Woodturners  
Gallery of Wood Art Exhibit  
David Ellsworth—Woodturner  
July 1 – September 30, 2011**

This exhibition features deceptively simple vessels by a woodturning master whose works celebrate the nature of wood and the joy of pure form. A major influence in American woodturning, David Ellsworth's work is in the collections of Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Smithsonian American Art Museum and The White House, as well as the Minneapolis Institute of Arts. Ellsworth refers to wood as "nature's most perfectly imperfect material," and has spent the last forty years exploring, embracing and celebrating the nature of this often unpredictable medium.
