Now on Display: A Gathering of Spoons II
More selections from the collection of Norman D. Stevens. A spoon may often be seen as simply a mundane tool used to ferry food from bowl to mouth, but through the skilled hands of the artists and crafts people represented in this exhibit the spoon is transformed from a tool to a feast for the eyes. Stevens, a long-time collector of American fine craft, has contacted spooncarvers from around the world, inviting them to create nine-inch spoons for his collection. The exhibit features work by traditional Scandinavian and American carvers, as well as non-utilitarian sculptural pieces like Kristin LeVier's onion spoon. Ramsey County Historical Society - New Exhibit

Ramsey County Historical Society is pleased to host "Living la Vida en Ramsey County", an exhibition developed by Historian Leila Albert, to highlight the culture and history of the Mexican-Americans who have worked over the past century to build a flourishing community in the heart of Ramsey County. The exhibition will include gallery displays located in the RCHS Gallery, a review of books with focus on Mexican-American history, a self-guided walking tour through St. Paul's West Side, and a series of presentations and discussions to highlight the history of that community. Gallery displays in the RCHS represent and portray an overview of the history of Mexican-Americans in Ramsey County, and will be available in both Spanish and English. The exhibit opens on September 20th at 6pm. "Living la Vida" History Discussions will be held on October 20th in room 408 at Landmark Center with a presentation and discussion by Leila Albert focused on how a Mexican American community came to be situated in Ramsey County. The Rise & Fall of W.B. Foshay Fraud Trial Reenactment



Come learn the story behind Minneapolis' historic Foshay Tower, the tallest building west of Chicago when it was built in the 1920s, in an original play production of the trial of Wilbur Foshay. This production, a collaboration between Minnesota Landmarks and Writer and Director Joan Elwell, in partnership with Lakeshore Players Theatre, will be presented in the F. K. Weyerhaeuser Auditorium on October 6 and 7th at 7pm. Wilbur B. Foshay was an American businessman, who built a fortune buying utilities throughout the Midwest in the early 20th century. Foshay built the Foshay Tower, which opened in August 1929. In 1932 he was convicted of conducting a "pyramid scheme" with shares of his own stock. The play production will act out the events of his trial and give insight into his case. Tickets are \$5 and include participation in the cast party following the show.
