## **Sundays at Landmark traditions and additions**

**ST. PAUL, Minn. (Aug. 30, 2017)**—Make plans for the 27<sup>th</sup> season of heritage festivals, musical performances, and holiday celebrations. Landmark Center's 2017-2018 season of *Sundays at Landmark* kicks off on Sept. 10 with the annual Mid-Autumn Moon Festival. The *Sundays* season runs September to May and consists of 20 Sunday afternoons of free and low cost, family friendly, events.

“*Sundays at Landmark* welcomes families and individuals to experience a broad menu of events,” said Judy Brooks, Director of Community Programs. “We celebrate the arts, and our diverse community’s cultural traditions by presenting experiences that are engaging, uplifting, and accessible. We’ll present 20 events this year, which means there’s almost always something going on at Landmark Center.”

The season includes long standing traditions, such as St. Paul Civic Symphony concerts, the Irish celebrations, Urban Expeditions, and the final Scottish Ramble after more than 30 years of the annual celebration.

This year’s additions are the Nooks and Crannies Tour, The Rose Ensemble concert and the Bandwidth Community Band Festival.
