"Make It and Take It" art workshop at Landmark Center

SAINT PAUL, Minn. (July 19, 2017)—Learn creative techniques directly from artists during the "Make It and Take It" workshop, August 13, 1-4 p.m., part of the *Summer Arts Discovery* exhibition. The workshop is free and open to all ages.

Guests will learn art making skills from Cathy Durso, Sophia Heymans, Judd Nelson, and Craig Snyder. Each artist will present methods they used in creating their art works featured in the exhibition.

"Part of Landmark Center's mission is to make the arts accessible to everyone, and Summer Arts Discovery does exactly that," said Amy Mino, Minnesota Landmarks' Executive Director. "This exhibition features not only world class artwork free of charge, but it also introduces the artists and their approach to art-making. The combination gives even the most novice art viewer insight into each piece."

Summer Arts Discovery, a building-wide exhibition, showcases works by 10 artists throughout Landmark Center. New this year, artists interested in participating were asked to submit artwork themed around collective or inclusive community. The exhibit is free and open during normal building hours through August 31.
