Landmark Center, New Deal exhibit open during the shutdown

Despite the ongoing government shutdown, the Landmark Center and its "Uncle Sam's New Deal" exhibit remains open to the public. Located in the Landmark's North Gallery, the exhibit explores the American social climate in the midst of the Great Depression and highlights President Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal programs as part of his effort to stimulate and stabilize the economy. Many of the Minnesota programs pushed forth by the New Deal were run out of the Landmark Center.
