Landmark Center COVID-19 Safety Protocols and FAQs for Visitors

Landmark Center is delighted to welcome you back to browse our exhibits and peruse our history. Visitors may book a free appointment entry time for any Wednesday through Friday (at 11am, 1pm, and 3pm) and Sundays (at 12pm and 2pm). For the safety of our guests and staff, a limited number of guests will be admitted during those times, and only those with appointments will be admitted. Appointments must be made *in advance* and will allow guests to browse Landmark Center for an hour-and-a-half.

In accordance with Minnesota Governor Walz' executive order 20-81 mandate, **all guests** must wear face coverings in this public building. We recommend guests bring their own, but we will supply one to any guest who needs a covering. Guests may tour galleries and explore the building-wide interpretation of "Uncle Sam Worked Here." While browsing, guests are expected to follow social distancing guidelines, and observe posted gallery guest count limits.

Visitors with special requests or in need of the accessible entrance can notify us at booking or call Sydney at 651-292-3063.

Plan Your Visit

When visiting any public place during this pandemic, there's always a risk of exposure to COVID-19. When visiting Landmark Center, you voluntarily assume all risk knowing that COVID-19 is extremely contagious, and that for some people it can lead to severe illness and even death.

If you plan to visit Landmark Center to tour the building and exhibitions, or other public offerings, you need to make an advance appointment to do so. Your registration comes with the expectation that you respect all current mandates to include wearing a face mask and social distancing and safety protocols that are maintained throughout the facility, and that you vacate the building as scheduled.

When registering for a visit, you agree to the following protocols:

- Please stay home if feeling sick, have COVID-19 symptoms, or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.
- You will be required to wear a mask while in the building. We encourage you to bring your own, but will supply you with one if needed. This is in accordance to the Governors Executive Order 20-81 mandating face coverings be worn in indoor public spaces to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Maintain social distancing – at least 6ft between others – including teachers, program participants or speakers, building staff, and other visitors. Limit use of elevators to just your group only. Adhere to posted gallery limitations.

- Be sure to cover coughs and sneezes, avoid touching mouth, nose, and eyes, and wash or sanitize hands frequently throughout your visit.
- Sanitization Stations will be available throughout the building, and upon entry.
- Use the Fifth Street entrance to Landmark Center for your appointment. You will be greeted by Landmark Center staff at the door. If you need to use our accessible entrance located on Market Street, please notify us at booking or by phone prior to your reservation and staff will greet you there. To notify us by phone please contact Sydney at 651.292.3063.
- Shared food or beverages are not allowed.
- You agree to vacate the building at your scheduled time, and you agree to NOT ALLOW access to any other persons to enter the building at any entrance/exit of the building.
- **You agree to will communicate these rules and protocols to all members of your group.**
- Visitors who become ill during the program should immediately quarantine and return home as soon as possible. A touchless thermometer is available for use if needed.

Landmark Center will:

- Limit guest count per reservation time slot
- Monitor all building access to ensure space for social distancing
- Post where limited access is necessary
- Sanitize high-touch surfaces during building hours frequently along with increased public space cleaning schedules.
- Provide touchless sanitization stations on each floor near the elevators.
- Provide face coverings if a guest does not arrive with one.

FAQ's about Visiting Landmark Center during COVID-19

Q. When is Landmark Center opening?

Landmark Center will be opening by reservation only starting Wednesday August 12th. Reservations will be limited to Wednesday – Friday and Sundays.

Q: How can I make a reservation?

You can make a reservation online or by calling Sydney at 651.292.3063. Reservations are available in advance:

- **Wednesday – Friday;** 11am, 1pm and 3pm.
- **Sunday;** 12pm and 2pm.

Q: What if I would like to visit outside of the posted reservation times?

Please call to arrange any visit outside of the pre-determined reservation schedule. Availability will be limited and some areas may be restricted. For visits outside of our reservation time please contact Sydney at 651-292-3063.

Q: Does it cost anything to visit Landmark Center?

No, Landmark Center and its galleries are free to visit.

Q: Where do I enter Landmark Center for my reservation?

All guests will enter at the 5th street entrance. If you need access to an accessible entrance, please notify us at booking, or call Sydney at 651.292.3063 prior to your visit and staff will greet you at our accessible entrance on Market Street at your designated arrival time.

Q: How long do we have to browse the building?

You will have 90 minutes to browse the building and its galleries. We ask that you exit 90 minutes after your reservation time.

Q: What if we are running late?

At this time, we are allowing 90 minutes from your reservation time. If you arrive late that does not extend your visit window. We are able to allow you in 30 minutes past your reservation time, beyond that we will consider your reservation void.

Q: Is there food available for purchase on-site?

No. Our in house Café has closed permanently. We do have vending machines located in the basement with limited snack and beverage options.

Q: Is the Gallery of Wood Art open?

At this time, the American Association of Woodturners' Gallery of Wood Art plans to re-open with a new exhibit on Sunday September 6th. If you have further questions about the Gallery please contact the American Association of Woodturners at 651-484-9094.
